Construction Project Updates:

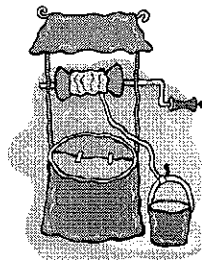
Lancaster Road Project ~ Lakes Hwy District is improving Lancaster Road from Ferndale to just east of Rimrock Road. The project involves moving NKWD's water main in a number of locations. This is due to the vertical height change of the road.

We are working very closely with Lakes Hwy District's contractor, SGI, to preserve and protect the existing water main and prevent it from being damaged during the course of construction.

There have been a number of fire hydrant and individual water meter relocations during the project. We'd like to thank those affected for their cooperation and understanding.

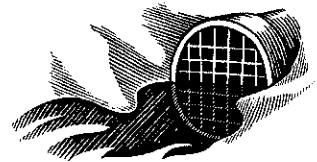
Hayden Well #2 ~ Drilling is in progress! The new well will serve:

- ◆ Prairie Shopping Center



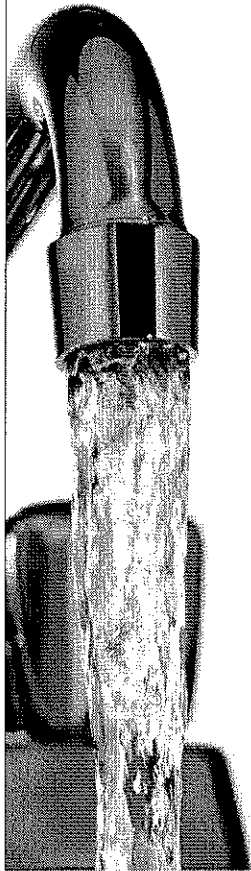
Sewer Line Replacement ~ FYI, On August 18th the Hayden Lake Recreational Sewer District will begin a new project;

replacing the existing sewer line from Strahorn Road to Kensington Avenue. Construction delay and detours are expected in this area.



Corbin Hill Estates ~ this new subdivision, located on the Chilco system, is nearing completion. The developer of this 40 lot subdivision is providing the District with funds to improve the existing pressure system. These improvements are currently being planned and are slated for installation in the very near future. Costs associated with the improvements are being wholly funded by new development, and not by the existing customers.

US HWY 95 ~ The Idaho Transportation Department (ITD) is preparing to begin improvements on US Hwy 95 from Hwy 53 to Ohio Match Road. This 1st phase does not impact NKWD. The next phase, slated for 2010, will have a direct affect on the Chilco system. ITD plans to convert Hwy 95 to a 4 lane divided highway as part of the 'Connecting Idaho Partners' project.
